Dear Parishioner,

I hope this newsletter finds you in good health and you are enjoying the Spring sunshine. This is the first edition of the South Swindon Parish Spotlight, which will be delivered 4 times each year, ensuring that everyone in our community stays informed about the parish council's services, projects, and events.

In recent months, we've made significant progress on several fronts. The Buckhurst Field Improvement Programme has progressed massively, with the Skatepark redevelopment and Shrewsbury Road Sports Pavilion redevelopment likely to be completed by the time this newsletter is being read. The Swindon

Robins Junior Football Club and Swindon Spitfires Women and Girls Team have been playing their home matches on the field since September 2024, and I'm so excited to see this project culminate with a permanent base for two of Swindon's community-minded football clubs.

I am delighted to see the new Eastcott Youth Club get off to a flying start, with over 20 young people signed up to the regular sessions at Eastcott Community Centre. The parish council has recognised the importance of youth clubs and proactive outreach for young people and are looking to expand the provision of our youth service over the coming year.



We have an exciting line-up of events at the Town Gardens Bowl this Summer, with open-air concerts, theatrical performances, and family-friendly events set against the stunning backdrop of our historic gardens. Throughout April, the Blossom Festival took over South Swindon, with many exciting events taking place in our parks and open spaces.

PARISH PRECEPT

For the 2025/26 financial year, the parish precept has been set at £181.36 per year for a Band D property, which amounts to roughly £3.49 a week. This ensures that the council can continue to maintain and grow essential services, support ongoing projects and plan for the future development of the parish.

What do you get for your COUNCIL PRECEPT?

Did you know South Swindon Parish is the sixth largest Parish Council in the country? The budget for 2025-26 has been set and will see residents of an average band D property pay **£3.49** per week for all of the services we provide.



The Parks: £0.47

The parish council is proud to run three major parks within Swindon: Town Gardens, Queen's Park and GWR Park, supported by a dedicated team. The Parish Council has invested significant sums into all three sites and there are exciting plans for the future.

Libraries: £0.14



We have operated an incredibly successful community library in Old Town since 2017. Since then our borrowing has increased by 350%. Building on that success we have since opened the first new community library in Swindon for 20 years in Badbury Park. Both libraries host various events and activities for residents throughout the week. We also fund 20 hours worth of staffing at Parks Library.



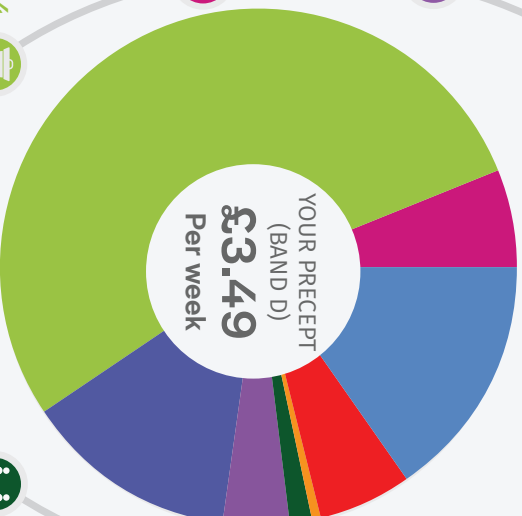
Other (Buildings, Allotments, etc): £0.19

We are responsible for 14 allotment sites, a community centres a depot and a mail office. Our community centres are available for hire year round for community gatherings, meetings, classes and more.

Grounds and Services: £1.84



Including dog waste, street bins, pavement sweeping and litter picking, maintenance and play areas. We have two street sweepers that operate seven days a week cleaning the pavements of litter and leaves. We also collect any fly-tipping found on our routes. We are also responsible for 22 play areas in the parish. We employ over 30 staff to deliver this service year round.



Admin: £0.52

The administration team includes all office staff and executive officers, who work hard to ensure all council services run smoothly and efficiently. The cost of running this service includes salaries, insurance, staff training, the website and election expenses.



Events: £0.20

The parish council organises a full calendar of summer events, bandstand concerts and the Enchanted Gardens Light Trail in December at the town gardens. We also run and host many community events at Queen's Park and GWR Park.

We also support other events in South Swindon such as the My Dad's Bigger Than Your Dad Festival and the many events on Wood Street, which we insure and sponsor.



Grants and In Bloom: £0.02

The grants service is available to support community groups and charities inside our parish. We also offer hands on support for lots of voluntary groups, offering equipment and services where they are needed. South Swindon in Bloom is a volunteer led programme which aims to brighten up and take pride in the town through horticulture. The bee symbol (right) can be found on fingerposts throughout the parish and signify areas designated for re-wilding.



Youth and Community Development: £0.05

The parish council supports various youth and community development schemes in the parish. This includes the Buckhurst Family Fun Day and supporting groups such as Prime Theatre who run free summer workshops in our parks.





PARKS & OPEN SPACES UPDATE



The council have managed 3 heritage parks since 2019, Town Gardens, Queen's Park and GWR Park.

We have made a number of much needed improvements to the parks over the past 6 years, including the refurbishment of the Grade II listed Quarry Road gates at Town Gardens, the creation of a new Blossom Circle at GWR Park, which sits on the footprint of the old bandstand, and the restoration of the Mesothelioma Garden in Queen's Park.



Since last year, GWR Park has benefitted from two part-time gardeners, ensuring the park gets the attention and care it deserves. The Blossom Circle and the blossom trees lining the entrance to the park have looked stunning this Spring, and they will get better each year as the trees mature.

Town Gardens has been looking fantastic throughout Spring. We hope park visitors have enjoyed the blossom and sunshine. The council enjoy seeing park visitors enjoy the beautiful blossom displays and admiring the hard work of our gardeners.



In Queen's Park our grounds and maintenance teams have started tackling the duckweed on the big lake, which will take some time to clear. Our teams cleared the small pond in front of the hothouse last year and have implemented successful measures to prevent excessive duckweed growth from returning. Queen's Park celebrates its 75th anniversary in November. The council are looking to mark this occasion with new features and improvements, so keep an eye out for news and updates regarding Queen's Park.

SERVICES UPDATE

South Swindon Parish Council is responsible for a range of grounds maintenance and street cleaning services, including grass cutting, shrub maintenance, pavement sweeping and litter picking. We also have two street sweepers that operate seven days a week cleaning the pavements of litter and leaves and empty approximately 90,000 bags of litter a year from the 380 street bins, litter picking and fly tipping collected.

The council is also responsible for maintaining 22 play areas across South Swindon. We have a play maintenance team who inspect, maintain and repair our sites. Having a dedicated play team capable of repairing equipment has saved the Parish Council tens of thousands of pounds in contractor fees and makes us responsive to urgent repairs.

This year, our fleet of vehicles are due for renewal. Our Grounds Maintenance and Street Cleaning teams currently operate 10 vehicles and we're making a substantial shift toward net-zero by replacing many of our vehicles with a new electric fleet. This eco-friendly transition represents the council's commitment to reducing emissions while maintaining excellent service standards.



Throughout the summer months, our grounds team will be undertaking a regular programme of grass cutting and mowing. This will take place across all of our parks, verges, play areas and open spaces that we manage. The Parish Council aims to cut all amenity grass across the Parish on a 3-weekly basis, depending on weather conditions. The Parish Council also manage 9 rewilding sites across South Swindon Parish which are cut once a year by our grounds maintenance team. PROJECTS UPDATE

As a parish council, we are constantly looking for ways to improve South Swindon. Each year we deliver numerous projects that improve our facilities and the health & wellbeing of South Swindon residents.



Broadgreen Community Centre, the South Swindon Parish Office and Buckhurst Sports Pavilion in Walcot will soon be equipped with state-of-the-art solar panels, making them more energy-efficient and reducing the long-term operating costs for our community buildings. This investment is in part thanks to a £20,000 grant from the Science Museum Group Solar Park and has been supported by the Harbour Project who operate from Broadgreen Community Centre.

The parish council is currently preparing a bid for the National Lottery Heritage Fund to help transform the Town Gardens Bowl and enhance the public amenities in the wider park. The multi-phase redevelopment project aims to restore the Bowl and enhance its facilities to meet modern standards. Plans include:

- Restoring the structure to a modern standard that can be used by future generations.
- Improving accessibility with upgraded entrances and pathways.
- Constructing new backstage facilities for performers including new dressing rooms, toilets, a kitchen and other amenities.
- Elevate the overall visitor experience at the Bowl and allow it to host a wider range of events.

We have already raised more than £200K towards the Bowl restoration project and once complete this redevelopment will ensure the Bowl can become a premium events space for community events, performances, and gatherings. Other projects completed so far this year include the carving of Great Western Railway pioneer Sir Daniel Gooch in GWR Park, completed by wood carver Graham Derham. This project ties in with the recent improvements to the park such as the new formal beds and the Blossom Circle. The Town Gardens pond has received a makeover by our gardeners and maintenance team, with the coping slabs repointed and the fountain restored. A net will soon be installed over the pond to protect the fish and prevent detritus from falling into the water so that water quality can be maintained.



BUCKHURST FIELD

IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME

This year has seen a massive push at Buckhurst Field with the ongoing improvement programme making a number of noticeable changes to the area.

Since the beginning of 2024, the Parish Council have undertaken an ambitious improvement programme for Buckhurst Field that has enhanced the sport and recreation facilities across the site. Over a period of 18 months, the field will have seen over £600,000 of investment from the Parish Council and its partners.

New murals will be painted onto the new skatepark and we hope that The skatepark will formally reopen on Saturday 24th May at the Buckhurst Youth Festival event, with local skate warehouse, ATBShop, hosting a series of skating workshops from 11am. The Buckhurst Improvement Programme has been funded by South Swindon



At the time of writing the sports pavilion is nearing the end of construction, with Robins FC ready to move in. The new pavilion will boast modern changing rooms, showers, a kitchen, and a mini-depot for the grounds team. Solar panels will be installed on the roof of the building, massively improving the energy efficiency of the site and reducing the operating costs.

The Buckhurst Skatepark project has also seen a lot of progress in recent weeks with the concrete being poured in and the first new ramps starting to take shape. The new design has been

SOUTH SWINDON YOUTH SERVICE

SOUTH SWINDON IN BLOOM UPDATE

South Swindon in Bloom is a town-wide horticultural movement which aims to improve and regenerate our local environment.

The South West competition is part of RHS Britain in Bloom, which inspires community groups in towns, cities and villages to make positive changes to their local environment through horticultural, environmental and community action. South Swindon Parish Council first entered the pennant competition in 2019 and was awarded a Silver Medal and a trophy for Best Victorian Park. There was no competition in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions and in 2021, we again achieved a Silver Medal followed by a Silver Gilt Medal in 2022. In 2023, we entered into the main competition for the first time and we achieved a Gold medal and won the Tesco Cup (category for large towns). In 2024, we were automatically entered into the 'Champions of Champions' category, and once again achieved a Gold medal.

There are over 20 community groups which make up South Swindon in Bloom, including the Old Town Community Gardeners, Friends of Shaftesbury Lake, Growing South Swindon Community, The Gap Community Garden and the Angel Ridge Community Gardeners, to name a few. A steering group oversees the entry each year, deciding the portfolio and the route the judges take,
